Jubilee 2025 - Pilgrims of Hope: The Vatican has stated that pilgrims unable to visit Rome can also receive the Jubilee plenary indulgence by visiting a cathedral or other sacred place designated as a Jubilee site by Church leaders. The Archdiocese of Winnipeg has designated eight Jubilee sites which include: St. Mary's Cathedral, St. Laurent Church & Grotto, St. François Xavier Church, St. Augustine of Canterbury Church, Ste-Rose-De-Lima Church & Grotto, Holy Ghost Church, St. Kateri Tekakwitha Indigenous Church and St. Gianna Beretta Molla Church.



Our Jubilee Pilgrimage: In announcing this Jubilee, Pope Francis reminded us that "the Christian life is a journey calling for moments of greater intensity to encourage and sustain hope as the constant companion that guides our steps toward the goal of our encounter with the Lord Jesus," and that "pilgrimage is, of course, a fundamental element of every Jubilee event" (*Spes Non Confundit*).

On May 10th, several parishioners were blessed to embark on a pilgrimage to the Bishop Velychkovsky National Martyr's Shrine at St. Joseph's Church (250

Jefferson Avenue). This two-hour pilgrimage included a tour of the church and a presentation on Bishop Velychkovsky, and other martyrs. It was a beautiful and truly remarkable experience. Despite the differences between the Eastern and Western Rites, we are united in the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. Our parishioners returned home inspired and uplifted, carrying with them renewed hope, healing and a deeper understanding of our faith—and of the courage of the martyrs who gave their lives in its defense.
