

Mary Among Us - Home Visitation Program: In response to Our Lady's call to pray the Rosary, our parish is introducing the Mary Among Us – Home Visitation Program. Through this program, families are invited to welcome a statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary into their homes for one or two weeks. This is a beautiful opportunity for families to grow closer to God through her intercession and to share in the peace of praying together.

Families may sign up in the narthex to host the statue. The statue can be picked up on Friday after the evening Mass and should be returned the following Friday (or after two weeks). The pick-up and drop-off location will be the crying room. A prayer guide is provided with the statue to help families pray the Holy Rosary and consecrate their homes and families to the Sacred Heart of Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
