Please consider the following information to help in your discernment:

The PPC is the main body for lay leadership in the pastoral life of the parish. Its purpose is to engage and enable the whole parish community to a fuller participation in the mission of the parish, fostering pastoral activity within the parish's mission.

United with the pastor, PPC members pray as our ancestors did in the “Upper Room”, reflect as Jesus did throughout his life, and guide and inspire the parish with their gifts of wisdom, knowledge and understanding to define the pastoral situation of the parish and the initiatives required to meet those needs. Simply put, the PPC collaborates to allow the needs of the parish to be heard, learn from the world around us, and speak in a manner that reaches the realities of the people.

A PPC member is a practising Catholic, understands the purpose and method of operation of a Parish Pastoral Council, is committed to the mission of the whole parish, works well with others, and has good communication skills.

Our PPC usually meets once a month, except during the summer months. Decisions and recommendations are made through consensus or by vote if consensus can't be reached.

On some occasions, members *may* be asked to do presentations, meetings, or workshops, and to encourage spiritual growth and leadership formation of parishioners.
